
## **PUCCINIA PARNASSIAE**

Teliospores in optical section and in surface view, × 1500. Strands between warts evident only with phase-contrast.

PYCNIA, AECIA and UREDINIA lacking. TELIA localized, amphigenous and caulicolous, blackish brown, pulverulent. TELIOSPORES (fully cleared) 23-42(-44)  $\mu$  long, 13.5-22.5  $\mu$  wide, not (to slightly) constricted at septum, short- to long-ellipsoid or cylindrical with rounded ends; walls 1.2-2.2  $\mu$ , yellow-brown to light chestnut (cleared), with small warts ca. 0.2-0.4  $\mu$  high and 0.6-1.0  $\mu$  diam. above, grading to smooth about 1/2-3/5 toward base, under phase contrast the warts often seem to be linked by very delicate strands; germ pores apical to slightly depressed with small pale yellow cap to 2.0  $\mu$  high, and septal - 3/4 depressed with smaller cap; pedicels hyaline, generally cleanly deciduous but seen to 90  $\mu$  long, basal to slightly (-moderately) offset.

HOST: Parnassia fimbriata König.

NOTES: The type, from Banff, Alta., collected by Holway has not been seen, but the Mt. Stephen collection is from within 40 miles of the type locality. All the Canadian specimens, and one each from Montana and Utah, are extremely uniform. *Parnassia fimbriata*, the only recorded host, is specific in its habitat: moist montane to low-alpine slopes rather tahn lowland marshes. *Puccinia parnassiae* does not resemble any of the rusts of Saxifragaceae (*sensu stricto*), providing an additional reason for assigning *Parnassia* to a separate family Parnassiaceae.

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
